

# Star Scarf

## FINISHED SIZE:

9¼" wide and 48" long, after blocking (about 5" wide and 60" long before blocking).



## YARN:

Valley Yarns 8/2 Tencel (100% Tencel; 3,360 yd [3,091 m]/1 lb): adobe, 1 cone. Yarn distributed by WEBS. One cone will make several scarves, depending on finished size (see Notes).



## NEEDLES:

Size 15 (10 mm). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.



## NOTIONS:

Tapestry needle; size G/6 (4 mm) crochet hook.



## GAUGE:

12 sts and 8 rows = 4" in patt, unblocked.



## SKILL LEVEL:

Easy  



# STAR SCARF

## STITCH GUIDE

**Garter Star Pattern:** (multiple of 3 sts)

**Rows 1 and 3:** (RS) Knit.

**Row 2:** (WS) K2, \*yo, k3, pass first st of k3 group over 2nd and 3rd sts; rep from \*, end k1.

**Row 4:** K1, \*k3, pass first st of k3 group over 2nd and 3rd sts, yo; rep from \*, end k2.

Rep Rows 1–4 for patt.

## NOTES

- ◆ This scarf uses only a bit of yarn—it's a great project for using up laceweight odds and ends after knitting a larger project. Lace should be blocked to open up the stitch pattern. Blocking will increase the width and decrease the length—plan size accordingly.

## SCARF

Use the knitted method (see below) to CO 15 sts. Work in garter star patt (see Stitch Guide) until piece measures 60" from CO, or desired length. BO all sts very loosely; do not cut tail.

border of single crochet (see below) around entire perimeter of the piece as foll: Work 2 sc in edge st of each row and 5 sc in open spaces between star clusters at short ends of scarf. Weave in ends and block thoroughly, opening up fabric. Trim ends. ■

## FINISHING

With crochet hook and tail of yarn, work a

**Finished Size** 9¼" wide and 48" long, after blocking (about 5" wide and 60" long before blocking).

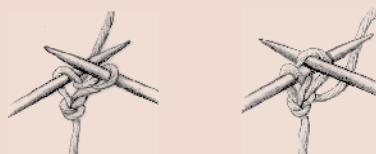
**Needles** Size 15 (10 mm). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

**Notions** Tapestry needle; size G/6 (4 mm) crochet hook.

**Gauge** 12 sts and 8 rows = 4" in patt, unblocked.

### Knitted Cast-On

Place slipknot on left needle if there are no established stitches. \*With right needle, knit into first stitch (or slipknot) on left needle (Figure 1) and place new stitch onto left needle (Figure 2). Repeat from \*, always knitting into last stitch made.



### Single Crochet (sc)

Insert hook into a stitch, yarn over hook and draw a loop through stitch, yarn over hook (Figure 1) and draw it through both loops on hook (Figure 2).
